

Foundation Degree Islamic Studies (Part Time)

Who is the programme for?

This course has been designed for people who wish to develop their knowledge and understanding of Islamic Studies and also gain a higher level qualification. The combination of academic knowledge and vocational skills gained on the programme will enable students to improve their effectiveness in the workplace or progress to the final stage of an Islamic Studies degree.

How long does it take to complete the course?

Four academic years of part time study. The foundation degree programme is delivered over two sessions per week. Students complete 60 credits each year.

What entry qualifications do I need?

Entry requirements: 2 GCE A levels or Access to HE Certificate or BTEC National Diploma or VCE A level / Double award or and GCSE English (Grade C) and GCSE Mathematics (Grade C) or equivalent

Applications from people over 21 without the above qualifications but with relevant experience and or other qualifications are also encouraged. All applicants will be considered on their individual merit and commitment to study. All applicants will be required to attend an interview with a member of the course team and to complete an assessment
